## Premier's Reading Challenge



Stuck for things to do this holiday? Consider supporting your child's literacy journey by taking part in the Premier Reading Challenge.

The Premier's Reading Challenge is a literacy engagement program that was introduced by the Premier in 2014 to:

- Encourage students to read more books and enjoy reading.
- Improve literacy levels.

The Challenge requires students to read 12 books between the beginning of the school year and early September.

How do I complete the Challenge?

- Get a Student Reading Record from your child's teacher or download one from the website ([www.premierreadingchallenge.sa.edu.au](http://www.premierreadingchallenge.sa.edu.au)). The Junior Primary Classes are completing their sheets in class but please feel free to do one with your child.
- Read 12 books! 8 books should be from the PRC booklist and 4 from of your own choosing. If you want to know what books are on the list then access the website. The local libraries usually put a sticker on the front cover if the book is on the list.
- You can include E-books, audio books, shared books, class books and books in another language other than English.
- Fill in your Student Reading Record as you go, and get an adult to sign each one to verify the reading.
- Hand the form to your child's class teacher by the end of July.
- Wait for your award!
