# **External Review**

As part of our continuous school improvement we will be involved in an external school review with a review panel. The purpose of an external school review is to support schools to raise achievement, sustain high performance and provide quality assurance to build public confidence in government schools. All government schools will be externally reviewed every four years.

The focus of the review is to evaluate school performance. The review panel consists of a review officer and a trained review principal. The review will occur on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> & Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> August.

We will find out the aspects of the school's improvement that have been verified through the review processes as well as the improvements that we need to make in the future.

During the external school review, some students, parents, governing council members and staff will be asked to provide information to the review panel in a number of ways. These include:

- Individual interviews
- Group discussions (with students or staff or parents)
- Meetings (usually governing council, staff meeting)
- Visits into classrooms

# Abigail's Class-ICT


Our class is participating in an exciting competition this year.



With the help of the Smith Family our class has been able to design some robots to solve some




problems and then purchase some digital technology to create our designs. Some of the problems we

# **Wellbeing & Engagement Collection**

Students in our school have been invited to take part in a survey being conducted in Term 3, week 3.

**Purpose of the collection**: Young people's sense of wellbeing is an important part of their development and how they learn at school. The purpose of the survey is to seek students' views about their wellbeing and their engagement with school. Students in year levels 4 to 9 will participate in the Wellbeing and Engagement Collection. The information collected will help inform work in the education system and broader community to help improve young people's health and wellbeing.

What is the survey about?: The survey asks students about their social and emotional wellbeing; school relationships and engagement and learning in school; and physical health and wellbeing and after school activities. Students' answers will be kept confidential – no one will use the results to identify individual students.

What is involved in project participation?: Teachers will arrange for students to undertake the survey during class time. Students will be asked if they would like to participate and will be free to withdraw at any time. If you do not want your child to participate, please contact the school as soon as possible.

Will students' information be kept confidential? Students' answers to the survey will be kept confidential & results will not be used to identify individual students
