Breakfast Club: This will continue next term. Thank you to all the people involved in this. It's great for our children to start the day with full stomachs!

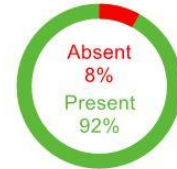
I hope you all have great two weeks off and look forward to seeing you all back at school on Monday 22nd July.

The Keys to Success: Organisation

In our last assembly of Term 2, we will be learning about the *Organisation Key*.

Organisation is a broad embracing foundation. Metaphorically, organisation provides students with their destination (goals), the road map of how to get there (time management) and ensures that students' mode of transport is serviced and ready to go (having the right materials to work).

Goal setting theory is quite straightforward. Students who set goals tend to be more committed to working to achieve them and learn to monitor their learning progress.

There is evidence that suggests that students who under-achieve do not value and appreciate the use of time for study. It is beneficial that all students be taught the value of time and time management from an early age and be made aware of the self-defeating aspects of wasting too much time.

Organisation skills are things as simple as:

- Planning ahead of time when to do homework
- Handing work in on time
- Making sure you understand instructions before starting work
- Having a neat desk
- Making sure you have all the materials you need to get through a school day

Goal setting and time management also strongly support the Key to Success of Persistence.
